

CRON CHEATSHEET

Cron Job Commands	
<code>crontab -l</code>	List all Jobs for the current user
<code>crontab -e</code>	Edit the cron jobs for the current user.
<code>crontab -r</code>	Remove all the cron jobs for the current user.
<code>crontab -r -u username</code>	Remove a specific cron job file.
<code>crontab -l -u username</code>	List cronjobs for a specific user (May require root access)
<code>* * * * * /path/to/command</code>	Schedule a job to run every minute
<code>0 0 * * * /path/to/command</code>	Schedule a job to run every day at Midnight
<code>0 17 * * 1 /path/to/command</code>	Schedule a job to run every Monday at 5 PM.
<code>0 2 * * 1 /path/to/command</code>	Schedule a job to run at 2 AM on the 1 st of every month.
<code>* * * * * /path/to/command >> /path/to/logfile 2>&1</code>	Redirect standard output and error to a file.
<code>*/5 * * * * /path/to/command</code>	Schedule a job to run every 5 minutes.
<code>* 15 * * 1-5 /path/to/command</code>	Schedule a job to run at 3 PM on Weekdays (Monday through Friday).
<code>15 * * * * /path/to/command</code>	Schedule a job to run every hour, on the 15 th minute.
<code>0 0 * * 6,7 /path/to/command</code>	Schedule a job to run at midnight on weekends.
<code>*/15 9-17 * * * /path/to/command</code>	Schedule a job to run every 15 minutes during business hours (9 AM to 5 PM).
