

CRON CHEATSHEET

Cron Job Commands	
crontab -l	List all Jobs for the current user
crontab -e	Edit the cron jobs for the current user.
crontab -r	Remove all the cron jobs for the current user.
crontab -r -u username	Remove a specific cron job file.
crontab -l -u username	List cronjobs for a specific user (May require root access)
* * * * /path/to/command	Schedule a job to run every minute
0 0 * * * /path/to/command	Schedule a job to run every day at Midnight
0 17 * * 1 /path/to/command	Schedule a job to run every Monday at 5 PM.
0 2 * * 1 /path/to/command	Schedule a job to run at 2 AM on the 1 st of every month.
* * * * * /path/to/command >> /path/to/logfile 2>&1	Redirect standard output and error to a file.
*/5 * * * * /path/to/command	Schedule a job to run every 5 minutes.
* 15 * * 1-5 /path/to/command	Schedule a job to run at 3 PM on Weekdays (Monday through Friday).
15 * * * * /path/to/command	Schedule a job to run every hour, on the 15 th minute.
0 0 * * 6,7 /path/to/command	Schedule a job to run at midnight on weekends.
*/15 9-17 * * * /path/to/command	Schedule a job to run every 15 minutes during business hours (9 AM to 5 PM).
